Called to Order at: 1852 hours.

- I. Discuss and take action on proposed TEEX testing and grading process.
 - a. Motion by Clay Deatherage, 2nd by Jimmy George to adopt the new direction for TEEX in developing and implementing SFFMA Testing.

We need to take care of some housekeeping on our testing process. In regard to the TEEX Tests, currently candidates are given one hour per exam with three exams offered. Here are the breakdowns for each initial exam.

Firefighter I: 50 questionsFirefighter II: 50 questions

· HazMat Exam: 50 questions total, broken down as follows:

o Awareness - 10 questions o Operations - 20 questions

o PPE - 10 questions

o Product Control - 10 questions

Should there be a need for a retest, the following are the make-up of the retest questions and each retest is independent:

Firefighter I: 50 questionsFirefighter II: 50 questions

HazMat Awareness Retest: 25 questions
HazMat Operations Retest: 25 questions

· HazMat PPE Retest: 25 questions

HazMat Product Control Retest: 25 questions

Recently we were requested to review the method in which the HazMat test was graded specifically. Under the current TEEX grading process, if a person fails any one section of the HazMat Test, then they fail the HazMat Test. For example:

If a candidate takes the HazMat Test and sores a 70% in Awareness (missing 3 questions at 10 points apiece), 70% in Operation (missing 6 questions at 5 points apiece), 60% in PPE (missing 4 questions at 10 points apiece), and 70% in Product Control (missing 3 questions at 10 points apiece); they fail the HazMat Exam (Graded as

Pass/Fail). TEEX is grading each section of the HazMat test as independent components of the overall test which have the weight of the overall test.

Another example is if a candidate takes the HazMat Test and sores a 100% in Awareness, 100% in Operation, 100% in PPE, and 60% in Product Control; they fail the HazMat Exam.

After meeting with Tim, Kevin, Andy, and Myself, we would like to make the following recommendation:

- · Firefighter I: 50 questions (both initial and retest)
- · Firefighter II: 50 questions (both initial and retest)
- · HazMat Initial Exam: 50 questions total, broken down as follows:
 - o Awareness 10 questions
 - o Operations 20 questions
 - o PPE 10 questions
 - o Product Control 10 questions
- · HazMat Awareness Retest: 25 questions
- · HazMat Operations Retest: 30 questions
 - o Operations 20 questions
 - o PPE 5 questions
 - o Product Control 5 questions

On grading the Hazmat portion of the test, we will only be grading sections: Awareness and Operations (Mission Specific & PPE rolled into Operations)

This will bring our HazMat Test in line with NFPA Standards, IFSAC Standards, and ProBoard Standards. Please review this and ask any questions you may have.
